MAYOR'S REPORT

THE MAYOR'S REPORT ON THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FINANCIAL REPORT AND THE EXTERNAL AUDITOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31 2022

The financial statements ending December 31, 2022 for the Municipality of the Township of Gore were tabled at the May 1, 2023 council meeting.

As stipulated in article 176.2.2 of the Quebec Municipal Code (C-27.1), at the regular Council meeting held no later than June, the Mayor gives a report on the municipality's financial situation which includes highlights from the financial report and the independent auditor's report for the previous year ending December 31st.

Here are the highlights for the year ending December 31, 2022.

MAYOR'S REPORT (cont'd)

A sum of \$ 170 244 was invested for the repair of Lac Grace and Lac Hughes Roads. These investments were financed by the 2019-2023 TECQ program.

Investments were made to build a bocce ball court and picnic tables for the municipal park at a cost of \$ 3 007. The municipality obtained a grant from Loisirs Laurentides' Espace muni program in the amount of \$2 797 to cover the cost of the investments. The balance of \$ 210 came from the general fund.

The municipality also invested in the expansion of the parking lot, the building of 3 sided shelters and the developed cross-country ski trails in Lake Beattie Park for an amount of \$ 124 310. The municipality obtained grants totaling \$ 64,120 for these projects and used the Park Fund to cover the \$ 60 190 balance.

A sum of \$ 44 267 was invested for the replacement of the generator at the town hall which is also used by the fire station so that emergency serves remain connected to the internet in the event of a power failure. The PRABAM grant paid for this entire investment.

The municipality also acquired a vehicle for the inspectors as well as a backhoe for the roads at a cost of \$ 124 210, financed by working capital.

The following amounts were also invested:

Property for resale:	\$ 17 144
Land acquisition: (paid by the general fund)	\$ 10 848
Land acquisition: (paid by the park fund)	\$ 16 838
Equipment for the various services:	\$ 29 573

The independent auditor's report on the consolidated financial statements is an official report. It, in all material aspects, gives a true and accurate view of the Municipality of the Township of Gore's financial situation and the financial situation of the agencies under its control, as of December 31, 2022. The statements are produced in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for the public sector.

Remuneration and expense allowance for elected officials

Section 11 of the Act respecting the remuneration of elected municipal officers (L.R.Q., chapter T-11.001) provides that "The treasurer or clerk-treasurer of a municipality whose by-law is in force shall include in the municipality's financial report a reference to the remuneration and expenses allowance that each member of the council receives from the municipality, an agency mandated by it or a supra-municipal body ...".

Here is the 2022 remuneration and expenses allowance for municipal council members:

The Good Neighbors Ecocentre

The Les Bons Voisins ecocentre was founded a few years ago so that residents of Gore, Mille-Îles and Wentworth could dispose of their residual materials while promoting reuse, recycling and recovery. The ecocentre is not a place to come and bring waste that can only go to the landfill.

To access the ecocentre: Proof of residence must be presented (driver's license, rental lease, most recent tax or hydro account, with a valid photo ID in addition).

The services are only offered to residents, not to small businesses or entrepreneurs.

In addition, the quantity of materials accepted per visit is approximately 1.8 m³, the equivalent of a 4'x 8'x 2' trailer or a pick-up box.

At the Ecocentre, each user is responsible for:

- Pre-sort materials when loading your vehicle.
- Make sure that your materials are indeed accepted at the ecocentre.
- Follow the attendant's advice once on site.
- Sort and deposit your materials in the right places according to the instructions of the attendant.

HERE IS THE LIST OF MATERIALS ACCEPTED AT THE ECOCENTRE

Construction, renovation and demolition materials:

- Wood and wood materials;
- Aggregates (asphalt, concrete, bricks, ceramics and stones);
- Shingles, gypsum and others.
- Metals

Information and communication technology products:

- Desktop computers, laptops, tablets and peripherals;
- Display devices (television, flat screen);
- Printers, photocopiers, fax machines and multifunctional devices;
- Video games and game consoles;
- Telephones, answering machines, cellular devices and pagers;
- Audio and video players (DVD or VHS).

Household hazardous waste: must be in original container, unmixed.

- Paint for domestic use including aerosols;
- Used oils, vegetable oils, oil filters and used oil containers including aerosols, coolant, antifreeze;
- Compact fluorescent lamps and fluorescent tubes;
- Primary and secondary batteries
- Used tires without rims
- Propane tanks
- Appliance with freon

MATERIALS REFUSED AT THE ECOCENTRE

The officer has the power to refuse materials or objects that are not on this list.

- Unsorted or large quantities of construction waste;
- Domestic waste;
- Hazardous industrial residues;
- Non-reusable furniture, mattresses and rugs;
- Boats;
- Asbestos residues;
- Animal carcasses;
- Contaminated land;
- Weapons, explosives and ammunition;
- Trees, branches and stumps;
- Solvents, thinners, stucco, tars, and tar-based sealers;
- Green waste (grass, dead leaves, garden waste);
- Lead acid batteries (automotive).

Bulky waste does not go to the ecocentre

The ecocentre is not a place to drop off your large bulky items that cannot be reused, recycled or recovered. These will go to the landfill and their collection is done according to the established collection schedule.

In Gore, once a month, you can put your "bulky items" on the road and they will be collected. The collection calendar is available on our website. A bulky item is: Washers and dryers, sofas, carpets, mattresses, small boats, empty oil and water tanks, tied branches and put in bundles of 1 meter maximum length.



On April 22nd, the 2nd annual meeting of the Gore Lakes Alliance of Associations was held at the Community Hall.

What is the purpose of this alliance?

The Alliance now includes 17 lakes with associations, including three new ones. Twenty-four representatives from these associations attended this meeting.

The purpose of the Alliance is for these associations to share concerns, information, solutions, and best practices in partnership of course with the municipality and other organizations/entities.

Did you know that there are about forty lakes in our small township of Gore (90 km²)?

Some of our associations have been in existence for over 60 years!

Have you experienced the magic of a body of water - creek, river, lake?

Do you have any idea of what a lake offers in terms of environment? Extraordinary biodiversity... one of these lakes last year recorded over 90 species of birds. Have you heard the bullfrogs at night? Listened to the loon? Observed the geese? Watched otters play, mink run along the water's edge? Listened to the owl or a pair of turtle doves?

On the other hand, have you experienced the sadness on seeing a sick lake?

Invaded by an aquatic plant such as Eurasian water milfoil or blue-green algae?

The preservation of the health of our lakes and the richness of the eco-system are fundamental. It also has a great impact on property values. The municipality cannot do this alone. It starts with the involvement of each resident, supported by their association.

Anthropic? Eutrophication? Watershed? Conservation reserves? Water quality? Shoreline protection? AirBNB?

These are among others, some of the many issues that affect our lakes in one way or another. For example, while many of Gore's lakes test their water, some do not.

For some, it is anthropic dams, for others it is an overpopulation of beavers, or eutrophication or the clarification of Gore regulations...

We also realized that some associations being newly formed, need to establish their priorities such as testing water quality.

Sharing information and best practices helps to speed up the results.

Aquatic Plants: the inventory of aquatic plants in lakes was begun in 2016 by CRE Laurentides. This continued with Lakes Solar, Caroline, Evans, Anne and Hughes. With the help of Heather McCullough and Johanne Hayes from Lak Hughes, inventories were conducted last year at Lac Sir

John, Lac Barron and Lac Ray. No suspicious or invasive aquatic plants were found. The work of Heather McCullough and Joanne Hayes is remarkable. This year, these inventories will continue.

Beavers: Very concerned about an overpopulation of beavers, Lake Ray commissioned a study by a biologist and trapper (reimbursed by the municipality) and decided to train its own trappers to gradually become self-sufficient.

Septic Systems: The health of our lakes also depends on the condition of our septic systems. The municipality does a lot of work in this area. However, by knowing the proportion of non-compliant or non-emptied systems, the associations can exert a certain influence on the residents by informing them of the possible consequences for their lake: e coli, overabundance of phosphates, etc.

Conclusion

In a context of climatic disturbance and increasing urbanization, taking care of our lakes is the *raison d'être* of the Alliance of Gore Lake Associations, by promoting communication, exchange, and collaboration.
