THE ICE RINK AT THE MUNICIPAL PARK (45 CAMBRIA ROAD)

The opening of the ice rink at the Municipal Park will take place as soon as the winter weather and cold temperatures allow. Our road's team will start the flooding the skating rink as soon as it is cold enough to do so effectively.

We need at least three cold days of -15 or below for the ice to form properly. We will be posting on Facebook and on the municipal website to keep residents up to date on the state of the ice rink.

WINTER ACTIVITIES AT LAKE BEATTIE PARK

Winter at the Lake Beattie nature park is full of activity! There are in fact, 10 km of snowshoe trails and 10 km of classic cross-country ski trails waiting for you. Our warm and cozy yurt is there to welcome you after your outdoor excursion.

If you don't have equipment and would like to rent some, it is available at the park, at the following prices:

- Cross-country skiing - complete kit \$20/day
- Adult snowshoe \$15/day
- Children's snowshoe \$5/day
- Walking stick \$7/day
- Crampons \$7/day

COMMUNITY MAILBOXES

Following the interventions of the municipality regarding services offered by Canada Post, a letter was received confirming that, for the upcoming winter season, the Canada Post snow removal program has been modified for the Township of Gore. The changes are aimed at resolving the community mailbox snow removal problems experienced last year. Canada Post will carry out special inspections following the first storm to properly assess the situation. In addition, non-routine inspections could take place at community mailbox sites.

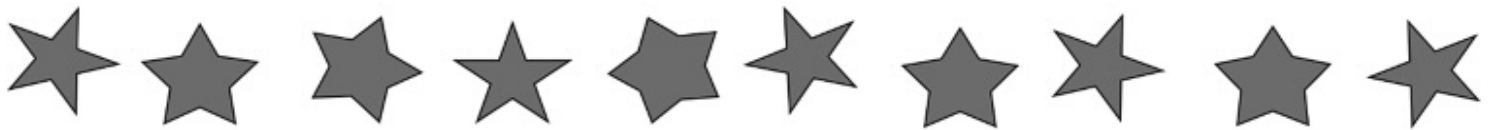

The organization aims to expand the social safety net surrounding seniors by promoting the involvement of volunteers (Sentinels) and the community (Eclaireurs program). More specifically, the organization wishes to:

- Reach out to seniors living in vulnerable situations.
- Offer listening, support, comfort, and help to seniors.
- Inform, guide and support seniors towards appropriate resources and services.
- Train "Sentinels" so that they become the eyes, ears and ambassadors of the organization.

SEPTIC SYSTEMS AND GOOD PRACTICES

With the arrival of the holiday season, many of us are looking forward to welcoming visitors who come to celebrate the holiday season with us and enjoy our wonderful countryside for a few days. As all Gore properties are equipped with a septic system, there are several good practices you should follow to ensure that it continues to work properly.



REDUCE WATER CONSUMPTION

- Repair any leaky faucets or toilets.
- Add water saving devices to taps and showers.
- Use water-saving toilets.
- Spread the use of large water-consuming appliances such as dishwashers and washing machines over different days.
- Reduce the time spent in the shower and limit baths..



Don't forget to use biodegradable cleaning products (shampoo, dishwashing liquid, laundry soap) to make sure you don't harm the biological processes of good bacteria in your septic tank.

ENZYMATIC AND BACTERIAL ADDITIVES

Enzymatic or bacterial additives have no long-term effect on septic system operation. Numerous scientific studies have shown that, statistically, there is no advantage to using these products. Regular maintenance and reasonable use of the system will ensure its longevity and the proper treatment of residential wastewater.

THINGS THAT ARE NOT TO BE DISPOSED OF IN THE SEPTIC TANK

- Bleach, disinfectants, drain cleaners.
- Paint, oil, solvents, chemicals.
- Wipes, personal hygiene products, hair.
- Cooking grease and table scraps.

Christmas can be a stressful time of year, especially in today's difficult and unstable economy. But by changing a few well-established habits, you can not only save a lot of money, but also have an eco-friendly Christmas. Here are a few tips to simplify your life.

Limit food waste: Tons of food are thrown away every year after the holiday season. To avoid waste, you need to plan ahead. Make a list of your menu and the items you'll need. If possible, buy locally or in bulk, and share the cost with friends and family. Low-cost vegetable baskets are also a fantastic option.

THE CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT

The Christmas Bird Count (CBC), which began in 1900, is the oldest citizen science program in North America. It brings together participants in more than 2,000 locations throughout the Western Hemisphere. This year, the CBC Argenteuil census is back for the second time!

If you would like to join this activity, there are two ways to do so. You can sign up as a "route participant," meaning you would be part of a field team in one of the circle's many divisions, searching for birds on foot, by car or otherwise. You can also sign up as a "feeder watcher," which means you can stay in the comfort of your home, watching your feeders and yard and simply report anything you see at the end of the day.

This year, the census is scheduled for December 23, 2023. If you are interested in taking part, please contact us before December 9, 2023 so that enough time is given for organizers to distribute sectors and train teams if necessary. Please don't hesitate to contact us with your questions. Also, if you know anyone (family, friends) who would like to participate, feel free to send them the invitation as well! If you can't participate, please keep your feeders full and if you see neighbours peeking at your feeders on December 23rd, know that they are only looking at the birds.
